

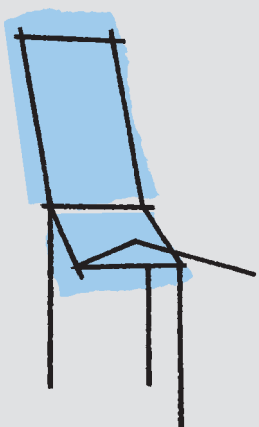

- Books and other media for learning German
- Fiction, non-fiction, specialized literature; novels in foreign languages, including Arabic, English, French, Greek, Italian, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish and Turkish
- Magazines and newspapers; Library PressDisplay of newspapers and journals in more than 50 languages from over 100 countries
- Children's books in foreign languages, including multilingual editions; board and card games
- DVDs with soundtracks and sub-titles in multiple languages; audio books in German and foreign languages; music CDs and sheet music

A Place to Spend Leisure Time and Meet With Others

- Our collections can be used in the library free of charge and without a library card
- Groups can meet here to read, learn, and exchange ideas
- Visit our exhibits and programs and events for children, adolescents and adults
- Use the library PCs to access Internet free of charge 15 minutes every day
- A library card allows use of library PCs for 1 hour a day, free of charge, and unlimited use of WLAN



What Do You Need To Get a Library Card?

Bring along your identification card, passport, or a residency permit that is valid for at least six more weeks.

Adults (over 18 years) pay an annual fee of EUR 18, or EUR 3 for one month.

Children and young adults up to 18 years can receive a library card free of charge. Children under the age of 14 must have written permission of a parent or guardian.

Rules for Borrowing Books and Media

All media can be borrowed for four weeks; in most cases, the renew of the loan period is possible.

Books and media should be returned within the lending period or the loan renewed. For late returns a fine of EUR 2 per media per week will be charged.

Damaged or lost media must be replaced.

To place a reserve on media currently lent out, there is a fee of EUR 1.
